TINGEWICK AFFORDABLE HOUSING SCHEME STARTED ON SITE

A Parish Council initiative turned into reality

In January 2004, a representative from Hastoe Housing Association and the Buckinghamshire Rural Housing Enabler were invited to meet the Chairman to Tingewick Parish Council and discuss a potential affordable housing project in the village. Following this meeting, a housing needs survey was carried out in the village during February 2004 and all returned forms were analysed and a list of all those in housing need was compiled.

Following validation of the housing need in Tingewick by Council Officers (and taking into account information from the Housing Register and Housing Sales Register for Shared Ownership dwellings), it was concluded that there was a need for eight units in the parish. The mix and tenure of units is detailed overleaf.
